

We are an exhibition group in Grade six and we would like to inform you about how to keep storm drains clean.

Keeping storm drains clean is important because all of the water that is collected in the drain flows into the ocean, and the water can pollute the ocean if it is contaminated.

Do not throw trash, paint, or cigarette butts in the storm drains.

Soon will be the season to wash your car, but please do not wash your car in your driveway. Instead, go to a car wash or wash your car on a permeable surface, rather than having all the chemicals flow into a storm drain. If you throw chemicals into a storm drain, a fish can eat the chemicals and die. If you pollute storm drains, you could be responsible for a fish dying. I know everyone would rather live their lives without that on their conscience. We hope you will make the right decision and keep storm drains clean.
